

Executive Committee Meeting Summary
March 19, 2025

1. Chairman Craig Hammer called the meeting to order and reviewed important dates found in the UHSAA Ready Reference Calendars (see www.uhsaa.org). Academic All-State deadlines were also discussed.
2. Mr. Rob Cuff provided the Committee with a list of winter state champions and the UHSAA staff reviewed winter activities, which included basketball, wrestling, drill team, cheer and swim.
3. Mr. Jeff Cluff reviewed the winter ejection reports for coaches and players and provided an officiating update.
4. Mr. Everett Kelepolo, Executive Director of the UIAAA, reminded members that the UIAAA Conference for athletic administrators is April 9-12 in St. George.
5. Ms. Jan Whittaker reviewed UHSAA sportsmanship items.
6. The UHSAA Student Leadership Conferences will be held in the fall by region or on a multi-region basis.
7. Mr. Chris Shipman reported on the Unified Sports Tournament for basketball. The UHSAA and SOUT (Special Olympics Utah) are once again joining together to provide this outstanding experience for student athletes.
8. Ms. Missy Mackay-Whiteurs shared information regarding cheer safety clinics, softball, tennis and theatre.
9. Mr. Brenan Jackson discussed coaches' certification and the Executive Committee reviewed sports medicine advisory committee items.
10. The Christmas Moratorium will be December 21-25. Schools may change the Christmas moratorium dates sport by sport as long as it is five days and includes Christmas and submitted to UHSAA.
11. The Summer Moratorium is June 30-July 6. Schools may change the summer moratorium dates, but the change must be done as an entire school and submitted to UHSAA.
12. Mr. Cuff and Mr. Cluff led a discussion regarding RPI and Max Preps formulas. Both the 1A and 2A classifications will use the Max Preps formula to seed the 2025-2026 state championships for the sports that have been using the RPI.
13. All volleyball consolation games will remain a best 2 out of 3 format. Once a team loses a match, then matches will be best 2 out of 3 will all sets playing to 25.

14. Beginning in the 2025-2026 school year, both girls and boys volleyball in the 5A and 6A classifications will not have any consolation games on the second day of the tournament. The only exception will be a third and fourth place game played in a best 2 out of 3 format.
15. Ms. Whittaker provided an Esports update, which will be a sanctioned activity beginning with the 2025-2026 school year.
16. Mr. Cuff shared positive articles regarding education based high school activities.
