

Executive Committee Meeting Summary  
January 14, 2026

1. Chairman Craig Hammer called the meeting to order and reviewed important dates found in the UHSAA Ready Reference Calendar, UHSAA Moratoriums and Academic All-State deadlines (see [www.uhsaa.org](http://www.uhsaa.org)).
2. Ms. Teri Davis provided a USBE report.
3. Mr. Rob Cuff, Executive Director, shared with the Committee a list of fall state champions.
4. Mr. Jeff Cluff reviewed the UHSAA calendar. Refer to the UHSAA website for calendar updates.
5. The fall ejection report was reviewed and discussed.
6. Mr. Everett Kelepolo, UIAAA Executive Director, discussed the spring UIAAA Conference which will be held April 15-18 in St. George. He also gave a report on the NIAAA Conference which was held in Tampa, Florida, in December.
7. The Executive Committee discussed the Summer Moratorium adjustment for member schools. The dates for the moratorium are June 29-July 5. The application for adjustment must be made as an entire school.
8. Aktivate (RegisterMyCoach) and coaches' certification were discussed. All member schools must register coaches and verify certification.
9. The importance of interested schools signing up for Unified Sports in basketball, soccer, swimming and track and field was discussed. Schools need to contact Mr. Chris Shipman if interested.
10. Ms. Jan Whittaker reviewed sportsmanship items and led a discussion on the second summer moratorium approved by the Board of Trustees in November.
11. The track seeding that the 2A classification piloted this past year was approved by all classifications.
12. Ms. Missy Mackay-Whiteurs discussed cheer and softball items.
13. Mr. Cuff led a discussion regarding factors to the format and procedures for the next realignment of member schools.
14. Super Fan Award winners and Circle of Fame inductees were announced and will be honored at upcoming winter state tournaments.

15. Spirit of Sport and Heart of the Arts Awards were announced and will be honored at upcoming winter state tournaments.
16. The Executive Committee hosted a luncheon for the 2025 Distinguished Service Award winners. The Award honors outstanding contributors to Utah high school activities and brings together Utah's finest educators, officials and contributors at the high school level.
