## Executive Committee Meeting Summary November 9, 2022

- 1. Chairman Craig Hammer called the meeting to order and reviewed important dates found in the UHSAA Ready Reference Calendars (see <a href="https://www.uhsaa.org">www.uhsaa.org</a>).
- 2. Mr. Rob Cuff shared information regarding football endowment games. There were 53 games played this year and the UHSAA added over \$115,000 additional dollars to the endowment foundation.
- 3. The UHSAA staff reviewed fall activities, which included football, 1A and 2A fall baseball, boys' golf, volleyball, girls' tennis, cross country and girls' soccer.
- 4. Mr. Jon Oglesby reviewed the 2022-2023 calendar.
- 5. Mr. Marc Hunter, UIAAA, discussed the NIAAA conference in December, which will be in Nashville. The UIAAA conference will be held in April in St. George.
- 6. A reminder that the nominations for the UHSAA spirit of sport and heart of the arts awards will be due to the UHSAA by January 15, 2023.
- 7. Ms. Jan Whittaker discussed sportsmanship items, including the school video competition and the Gold Star Coach Award.
- 8. The Executive Committee discussed emerging sports and spent time hearing about Esports. More information will be discussed in the March meeting.
- 9. Mr. Brenan Jackson asked regions to remind schools that all coaches need to be put on RegisterMyCoach and certified by schools and/or districts.
- 10. Boys Soccer semifinals will be held at Zions Bank Stadium in the spring.
- 11. Mr. Jeff Cluff discussed coaches' credentials and provided the Committee with an officials' update.
- 12. Mr. Mark Van Wagoner, UHSAA legal counsel, provided a legal report.
- 13. A discussion regarding the shot clock in basketball resulted in Committee members voting to use the shot clock this season and during the post-season.
- 14. The UHSAA Awards Selection Committee met before the General Executive Committee meeting and selected the 2022 Distinguished Service Award winners. The Award honors outstanding contributors to Utah high school activities and brings together Utah's finest educators, officials and contributors at the high school level. Award recipients will be recognized at a luncheon during the next Executive Committee meeting in January.
